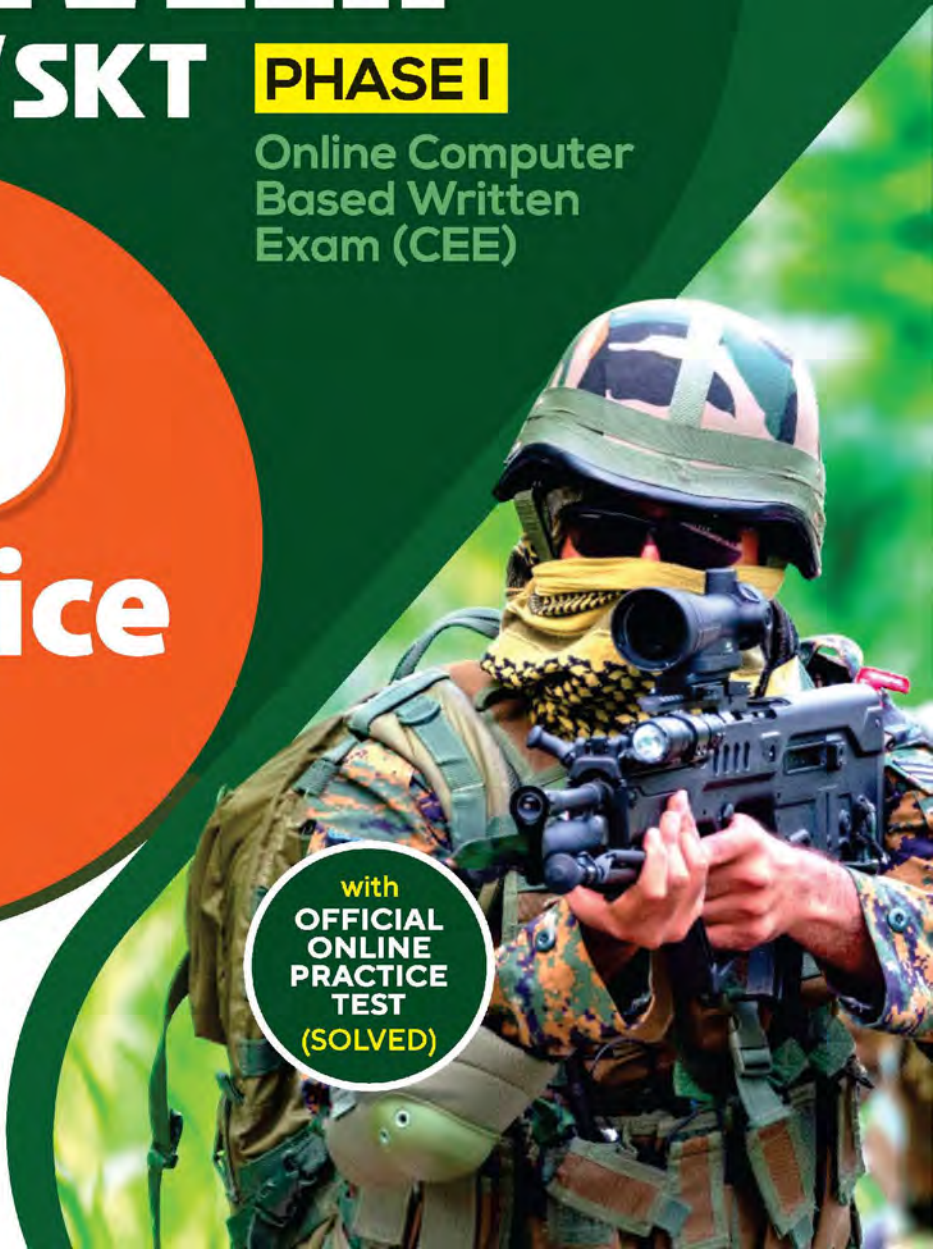

Medical Test

- As per laid down medical standards at the Rally Site.
- Unfit candidates will be referred to MH for specialist review. Candidates to report to designated Military Hospital within 5 days from referral and review medical exam to be completed by Military Hospital within 14 days as per policy.

Written Test through Common Entrance Examination (CEE)

- Will be conducted for medically fit candidates at nominated venue. Date and time of written test will be intimated at rally site and through Admit Cards.
- Admit Card for the CEE for the Rally Fit candidates will be issued at Rally Site itself.
- Admit Card for the CEE for the review Fit cases will be issued after getting medically fit by concerned specialist/specialists at MH.

SYLLABUS

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

The test will include questions related to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to History, Culture, Geography and who's who. In addition Abbreviations, Sports, Awards and Prizes, Terminology, Indian Armed Forces, Continents and Sub-continents, Inventions and Discoveries, The Constitution of India, International Organisations, Books and Authors, Knowledge of Important events that have happened in India and at world level in the recent years, Current important world events, Prominent personalities etc.

GENERAL SCIENCE

Questions of General Science will include topic related to Physics, Chemistry and Biology, based on fundamentals and day to day activities(i.e, difference between the living and non- living, basis of life - cells, protoplasts and tissues, growth and reproduction in plants and animals, elementary knowledge of human body and its important organs, common epidemics, their causes and prevention etc).

MATHEMATICS

- (i) **Number Systems** : Computation of Whole Number, Decimal and Fractions, Relationship between numbers.
- (ii) **Fundamental Arithmetical Operations** : HCF, LCM, Decimal fraction, Percentages, Ratio and Proportion, Square roots, Averages, Interest (Simple and Compound), Profit and Loss, Discount, Partnership Business, Speed Time, and Distance, Time and Work.
- (iii) **Algebra** : Basic algebraic problems
- (iv) **Geometry** : Familiarity with elementary geometric figures and facts.
- (v) **Mensuration** : Triangle, Quadrilaterals, Regular Polygons, Circle etc
- (vi) **Trigonometry** : Trigonometry, trigonometric ratios, complementary angles, height and distances etc.
