Solutions

1. (c) Sachin Tendulkar is associated with cricket. Tendulkar is an Indian former international cricketer who captained the Indian national team. He is regarded as one of the greatest batsmen in the history of cricket. He is the all-time highest run-scorer in both ODI and Test cricket with more than 18000 runs and 15000 runs respectively in total. He was honoured with Arjuna Award (1994), Khel Ratna (1997), the Padma Shri and Padma Vibhushan awards in 1999 and 2008, respectively, and Bharat Ratna (2013), India's highest civilian award.
2. (b) The Brazilian football player Neymar Jr. became the new ambassador of Handicap International on 15th August, 2017. Through this partnership, Neymar is using his huge fame for a good cause i.e., to support the most vulnerable people in the world, people with disabilities in poor countries, victims of conflicts and natural disasters. He plays as a forward for Ligue 1 club Paris Saint-Germain and the Brazil national team.
3. (b) Simplicity of clothing was symbol of 'equality' in France. Both men and women began wearing loose and comfortable clothing. Political symbols were also reflected in clothing. The French Revolution was started in 1789. The French Revolution has raised the question of liberty, equality and autocratic privileges.
4. (c) The childhood name of Mahatma Buddha (563 BCE to 483 BCE) was Siddhartha. He was born in Lumbini in modern day Nepal. His father was Suddhodan, the chief of the Shakya clan. He attained enlightenment at Bodhi Gaya, Bihar.
5. (b) After the Lok Sabha election held in 2019, the government was formed under the Prime Ministership of Narendra Modi. Modi is an Indian politician serving as the 14th and current Prime Minister of India since 2014. Modi was the Chief Minister of Gujarat from 2001 to 2014. He is the Member of Parliament from Varanasi. He is a member of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), a right-wing Hindu nationalist paramilitary volunteer organisation. He is the longest serving Prime Minister from outside the Indian National Congress.
6. (b) Coal is the most important raw material for generation of power in India. In India, power is generated from conventional (Thermal, Nuclear and Hydro) and renewable sources (Wind, Solar, Biomass etc.). However, major production of electricity is achieved through coal, a thermal power plant which is around 75% of the total power generation.
7. (c) According to the Census 2011 of India, Sikkim is the least populous state in India with a population of 6,07,688. Uttar Pradesh is the highly populated state in India. The population of this state is around 19.96 crores. Sikkim shares its borders with China in the North and Northeast, Bhutan in the East, Nepal in the West, and West Bengal in the South.
8. (c) President of India is nominated for a term of 5 years. The Indian President is the Head of the State and he is also called the first citizen of India. Article 52 of the Indian Constitution mentions that there shall be a President of India. Droupadi Murmu is an Indian politician who has been serving as the 15th President of India since 25th July, 2022. She is the first person belonging to the tribal community and also the second woman after Pratibha Patil to hold the office.
9. (d) Varnas was not a Varna of Indian society. Varna in the context of Hinduism, refers to a social class within a hierarchical caste system. The ideology is epitomised in texts like *Manusmriti*, which describes and ranks four Varnas, and prescribes their occupations, requirements and duties, or Dharma.
Brahmins Vedic scholars, priests or teachers
Kshatriyas Rulers, administrators or warriors
Vaishyas Agriculturalists, farmers or merchants
Shudras Artisans, labourers or servants
10. (c) The Opium War is the name given to the fighting between Britain and China. The First Opium War was fought from 1839 to 1842 between China and the United Kingdom, and was triggered by the Chinese Government's campaign to enforce its prohibition against opium trafficking by British merchants. The Second Opium War was waged by Britain and France against China from 1856 to 1860.
11. (d) Tooth enamel is the hardest substance in the human body. It helps to keep teeth strong and fights against cavity. It also helps teeth from decaying and erosion due to chewing and biting.
12. (a) The caves of Ajanta and Ellora belonged to Buddhists. The caves were developed in the period between 200 B.C. to 650 A.D.
